My dear Mr. Byrns:

Reference is made to your letter of July 15, relative to information desired by Mrs. Edythe R. Whitley, 1506 Hawkins Street, Nashville, Tennessee.

From the papers in the Revolutionary War pension claim, S. 38718, it appears that Marshall Galloway enlisted June 27, 1777, "at the lower cross-roads about thirty miles from Baltimore, Maryland", and served as private in Captain Brice's Company in the 3rd Maryland Regiment. He was in the battles of Brandywine, Germantown, Monmouth and the first battle of Camden, and the battles of Cowpens, Guilford and Eutaw Springs, also a number of skirmishes. He was discharged at the close of the Revolution.

He was allowed pension on his application executed November 22, 1825, at which time he was sixty-five years of age and a resident of Sullivan County, Tennessee.

In 1825 he stated that his wife was about five years younger than himself and that he had ten children all of whom had left him except two daughters, no names given.

He died December 17, 1827.

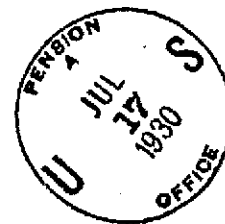

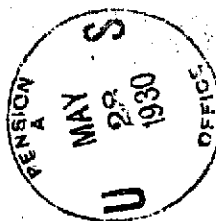
It appears that the error in Pension report of 1865 was where we have had considerable trouble in establishing the D.A.R. record of a lady desirous to join the chapter here.

As per your report to me May 21, the name should have read Marshall instead of Michael Galloway. This fact was most pleasing as I had previously found a grant in this state for Marshall and we could not distinguish the Michael as given in the pension report. I trust that you will forgive me for requesting the report of Marshall Galloway, at this time.

Dear Madam:

I advise you that the Revolutionary War records of this bureau fail to show a claim for pension on file on account of the services of Michael Galloway under any spelling of that surname.

The citation made by you applies to a pensioner named Marshall Galloway.

In the report of the Secretary of War, printed in 1838, his name appears on the list of Sullivan County, Tennessee, pensioners as Michael, which is an error.

A person descended from Michael Galloway would, of course, not be interested in the record of Marshall Galloway.

Personally appeared Marshall Palloway before  
me the undersigned Samuel Chew one of the  
acting Justices of the peace for said County  
I made oath that the answer to state in his  
original declaration now on file in this  
court affirms the fact that he had not disposed  
of his property since the 18<sup>th</sup> March 1818, was  
correct, he having made the full statement  
to the answer of his declaration - to supply  
which he now deposes, that he has not dis-  
posed of any of his property since the 18<sup>th</sup>  
of March 1818, nor has the same since that  
time been reduced. That he has had of  
necessity to raise and kill stock on which  
to subsist, of which it would be impossible  
for him to keep a remembrance, but that  
his general property has not been changed

some the aforesaid acts by sales, gifts or  
otherwise disposed.

first duly sworn according to law doth on  
his oath declare that he served in the rev-  
olutionary War as follows. To wit He  
enlisted at the lower crop roads in Maryland  
about thirty miles from Baltimore under  
Lieutenant James Allison who belonged  
to Capt Price's company of the Third  
Maryland Regiment which belonged to  
the Continental Army for and during  
the war in the month of June as well  
as he now recollects 1776 or 1777 and continued  
in service until the end of the war  
and was honorably discharged at Annapo-  
lis in Maryland was in service between  
five and seven years in succession  
He further states that he was in the battles of  
Brandywine, Germantown, Monmouth,  
Gates defeat before Camden, Cowpens,  
Gilford, under General Greene at Camden,  
at the Utaw Spring and a great number  
of skirmishes. To wit Tho Williams company  
of the Regiment to which he belonged  
which was attached to the Brigade of  
General Smallwood He remained in the  
Brigade of Smallwood until he was  
transferred to the south under Gates

And the said Marshall Galaway doth  
further solemnly swear that he was a  
resident citizen of the united States on the  
18th day of March 1818 And I have not  
since that time by gift sale or in any  
Manner disposed of My <sup>property</sup> or any part  
thereof with intent thereby so to diminish  
it as to bring myself within the provis-  
ions of the Act of Congress intitled an act  
to provide for certain persons engaged  
in the Land and Naval Service of the United  
States in the revolutionary War passed on  
the 18th day of March 1818 and that I  
have not nor has any person in trust  
for me any property or securities  
contracts or debts due to me; nor have  
I any income other than what is con-  
tained in the schedule hereto annexed  
and by me subscribed

who lives with him who is about five

but two daughters

The reason he did not apply to Government  
earlier is that he has been able to work  
at his occupation (farming) and support  
himself but he has become latterly so af-  
flicted with Rheumism <sup>at</sup> and other diseases  
incident to his period of life that he  
cannot clothe himself without assistance  
Nor can he labour for support

his discharge is lost and he does not know  
any person by whom he can now prove  
his service in this country Joseph Brownley  
of Maryland if alive would prove part  
of his service and William Cole of Deer  
Creek in Maryland could prove it if  
alive
